The National Society of Black Engineers is non-profit, tax exempt organization under section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Our goal for the Twenty-Third Annual Scholarship Banquet is to provide numerous scholarships to deserving but underprivileged North Alabama students. We offer Creative Minds Poster contest scholarships to elementary students to encourage academic excellence at an early age. The U. S. Space Academy scholarship will send deserving students to Space Camp for a week. The Timothy Briggs Leadership Scholarships are worth \$1000 for a deserving High School senior pursuing a degree in the STEM area. Essay scholarships worth \$150 are offered to high school students that are just interested in STEM.

NAL NSBE Professionals strives to reinforce the positive essence of minorities in our community and to increase minority participation and excellence in engineering and applied sciences; however, our scholarships are for ANY student with the desire to learn more about STEM.
